Class List and Description

Class A: Being a Police Officer

This presentation is an opportunity for students to learn about law enforcement and what it's like to be a Police Officer in the City of Minot. 19

Class B: Lessons About Your Money

Money plays an important role in our lives – we'll discuss how to make it, how to keep it, how to spend it, and what money around the world looks like. We will get to look at currency from all over the globe. 19

Class C: Operation Life Saver

Nearly every three hours, someone is struck by a train in the U.S. During this presentation, students will learn the skills they need to safely walk, bike, skate or ride near the railroad tracks. Students will also learn where it's safe to play, where it's not, and what they need to do when they get to a crossing. 19

Class D: Main Street ND

Learn HOW, WHAT, WHEN, & WHY to start your own 21st Century Business in today's technological world. Learn to recognize your strengths AND weaknesses and how to attract and retain the people you need to compete and succeed. 19

Class E: Excuse Me! Yes, Please! No, Thank You!

Students will learn common manners using presentations as well as role plays. 19

Class F: Let the World Surround You at Roosevelt Park Zoo

Weather permitting, the instructor will bring a live ambassador animal with her. In addition, she will be bringing biofacts for viewing (small skeletons, skins and taxidermy mounts). 19

Class G: Making Light

Presenters begin by explaining the parts of a copper atom and how electricity is conducted across one. Then the presenters explain the construction of a switch, fuse, and light bulb. After students understand, presenters break them into groups, distributing materials, and walk them through how to build a small circuit from a battery. This segment ends with the students turning on a light bulb and describing how it is able to produce light. **(This class is limited to a capacity of 24 students per session, per presenter request.)** 19

Class H: Technology in Tractors

Farming is more than just tractors and animals: there is a vast amount of technology involved that helps farmers be more efficient with the resources they have. In this class we'll describe how farmers use maps and GPS technology to farm smarter. 19

Class I: Electrical Keychains

Students will make an electrical keychain from tools and materials that electricians and plumbers use every day. 19

Class J: Power Plant Puzzle

Students will pair up in a team building exercise that utilizes their mechanical skills. They assemble nuts, bolts, linkage, and PVC into a replica of an original puzzle. **(This class is limited to a capacity of 30 students per session, per presenter request.)** 19

Class K: TEAM: Together Everyone Achieves More

In this interactive workshop, DECA High School Students will share the importance of Teamwork in school, at home, and at work. Students will learn what Teamwork is, why it is important, and how they can be a part of a TEAM. Students will participate in a mystery activity that will pair them with others so that they can learn how to achieve more as a TEAM. 19

Class L: It Takes All Kinds

What exactly does a firefighter do? Would you be surprised to learn that fighting fire is only a small part of their job? Find out why firefighting is such an important job and what you never knew about the work they do every day that makes a huge difference in everyone's lives. 19

Class M: Money Smarts

Personal Finance – we will be discussing the responsibilities on how to earn money, save money, spend money, technology and protecting your identity. 19

Class N: Agriculture 101

The class will cover basic animal science, plant science, and various other agricultural topics. Demonstrations and student hands on activities will be included. 19

Class O: Camping 101

This class will teach the students the basics of camping outdoors. We will learn about how to set up a tent and build a fire in addition to some wildlife you may encounter camping. **(This class is limited to a capacity of 24 students per session, per presenter request.)** 19

Class P: What Do Land Surveyors Really Do?

An interactive class talking about land surveying as a profession and what we do. 19

Class Q: Comedian/Magic – Why & How – Fun Sideline

The presenter will discuss how he got into magic, the entertaining aspect of comedy and magic, and show a couple of tricks and how they work. THE FUN OF MAGIC. 19

Class R: Flight: Physics or Magic (Hint...It's a Little of Both)

We will be constructing airplanes as we learn about the physics and magic of flight. *(There will be 2 classes only. Each class will be 2 periods long. 10:00-11:00 and 12:30-1:30.)* **(This class is limited to a capacity of 16 students per session, per presenter request.)** 19

Class S: Virtual Reality

A look into the world of virtual reality and its applications. **(This class is limited to a capacity of 16 students per session, per presenter request.)** 19

Class T: Get Up and Move

Take a break from classroom activities for fun and movement. Join the MSU Cheer Team in school spirit and some fun games to get you up off your feet. 19

Class U: Fish and Wildlife Service

Learn what the fish and wildlife service does and what a game warden does. Also, he will be bringing a remote control deer decoy and pheasant decoy. 19
