Class A: Main Street ND

Class C: All About Running a Greenhouse!

In this class, you will learn all about a greenhouse operation. There will be a short tour of the greenhouses and the students will get to transplant a plant. **(This class is limited to a capacity of 16 students per session, per presenter request.)** 19

Class D: Technology in Tractors

Farming is more than just tractors and animals; there is a vast amount of technology involved that helps farmers be more efficient with the resources they have. In this class we’ll describe how farmers use maps and GPS technology to farm smarter. 19

Class E: Lessons About Your Money

Money plays an important role in our lives – we’ll discuss how to make it, how to keep it, how to spend it and what money around the world looks like. We will get to look at currency from all over the globe. 19

Class F: Electrical Keychains

Students will make an electrical keychain from tools and materials that electricians and plumbers use every day. 19

Class G: Power Plant Puzzle

Students will pair up in a team building exercise that utilizes their mechanical skills. They assemble nuts, bolts, linkage, and PVC into a replica of an original puzzle. **(This class is limited to a capacity of 30 students per session, per presenter request.)** 19

Class H: Unites States Border Patrol

This class will explain the role a U.S. Border Patrol agent plays in the community. Not only are agents here to protect us, but also are strong role models. 19

Class I: Virtual Reality (VR)

A look into the world of virtual reality and its applications. **(This class is limited to a capacity of 16 students per session, per presenter request.)** 19

Class J: Annie's House Adaptive Recreation Program

Annie's House Adaptive Recreation Program started from one small list of 37 items. Today it serves around 500 people per year. Come learn about our program and do a hands-on activity to test your senses. 19

Class K: See Tracks? Think Train

Safety around Highway Rail Grade Crossings and the dangers of trespassing on railroad property. 19

Class L: Surveyors Make a Difference-Find Out How You Can Too!

Will do a presentation to increase awareness of a career in Land Surveying with the purpose to increase the number of people entering the profession. 19

Class M: Health Rescuers

Class N: Aerodynamics in Action

Participants will experience various types of airplane designs, along with creating and testing their own airplanes. **(This class is limited to a capacity of 24 students per session, per presenter request.)** 19

Class P: Water on Mars
