11 Rubber Egg

A chemical reaction occurs with between vinegar and calcium carbonate. This reaction will create carbon dioxide. If you look closely, you may see tiny bubbles forming on the side of the eggshell and float to the surface. The reaction will eventually dissolve the eggshell. Dawson W

12 Freeze-Dried Strawberries

Freeze-drying involves first freezing a fruit and then placing it in a vacuum under very low pressures. Low pressure causes ice crystals to rapidly sublime, turning them straight from solid ice into water vapour removing water much more efficiently than traditional drying. Harper H

This toothpaste is a foamy substance caused by the rapid decomposition of hydrogen peroxide (H_2O_2) using potassium iodide (KI) or yeast and warm water as a catalyst. How rapidly the reaction proceeds will depend on the concentration of hydrogen peroxide. lan B


