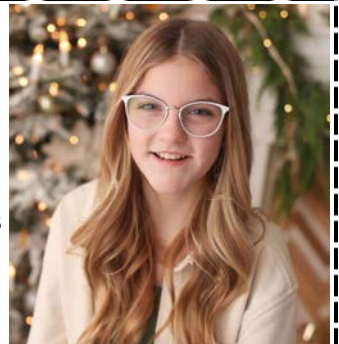

Katie Shannon was born and raised in Williston, ND and takes great pride in this community and the people that make it great! She has been married to her husband Rob for 20 years and together they have 3 children, Keira, Kane, and Quinn. Katie is a Licensed Clinical Social Worker and is the Clinical Director and owner of ConnectUs Therapy. She has been a mental health provider for the past 21 years, 17 of those years serving Williston, ND. Katie graduated as a Coyote and went on to receive a Master's degree in Social Work from the University of North Dakota. She began her mental health career by working at an inpatient mental health hospital for five years before moving to Williston in 2006. At that time she began work at Northwest Human Service Center until her transition to private practice in 2014. In April 2021 the trajectory of Katie's career was altered in unexpected ways when she received a behavioral health grant from Williams County. With that entrustment, Katie was able to expand her practice, and ConnectUs Therapy was born. In 2022 she helped establish the ConnectUs Foundation which is a 501(c)(3) non-profit that focuses on meaningfully advocating for the mental health and substance use treatment needs of the community, while also expanding access to supports that help people heal and live life to their fullest potential. Katie and the ConnectUs organizations believe mental health is essential and worth advocating for. Her community outreach advocacy events Not Today and Are You Ok? for suicide prevention and mental wellness, are the cornerstones of her organizations.
