PROJECT GUIDE

The following list is in order by school, teacher and table number. It includes the name of the project, description and exhibitor name(s).

St. Mary's School Mr. Ramos

1 **Bouncing Bubble**

The bouncing experiment demonstrates how a special solution, often containing glycerin, allows bubbles to bounce off surfaces, defying their typical tendency to burst | below less dense ones, creating due to surface tension and oils. Ava A

2 **Dancing Corn**

Demonstrates a chemical reaction between baking soda (a base) and vinegar (an acid) that produces carbon dioxide gas, causing corn kernels to "dance" up and down in a solution. Everlyn F

3 Jelly Soap

Creating a jiggly, fun-to-use soap using | a gelling agent like gelatin or agaragar, which traps water and creates a semi-solid structure, allowing the soap to wiggle and jiggle. Lauren R

4 **Natural Dyes and Paints**

Explores creating natural dyes and paints from readily available materials, focusing on extracting pigments from fruits, vegetables, and other natural sources to create a variety of colors. Esther D

5 **Galaxy Bottles**

Creating a visually captivating sensory bottle by layering colored water. Glitter, and sometimes cotton balls or other materials to mimic the appearance of a galaxy. Finley J

DIY Lava Lamp

Oil is hydrophobic so actively moves away from water molecules. The tablet reacts with the water, creating carbon dioxide bubbles. Theses bubbles float to the surface carrying with them some water. Once the carbon dioxide bubbles pop the water sinks back down below the oil.

Layered Liquid

Demonstrates density differences between liquids by layering them in a container, with denser liquids sinking distinct layers.

8 Rock Candy

Demonstrates crystallization by dissolving a large amount of sugar in water, creating a supersaturated solution, and then allowing the sugar to recrystallize on a seed crystal (like a sugar-coated string or skewer) as the solution cools.

Invisible Ink

Exploiting chemical reactions that become visible when heat or a pH indicator is applied.

10 **Magnetic Slime**

Manetic slime is created by adding iron fillings or powder to a standard slime recipe, resulting in a mixture that is attracted to magnets, allowing for fun experiments.

11 Ooblek

A non-Newtonian fluid made from cornstarch and water, exhibiting the unique property of acting like a liquid when moved slowly and like a solid when pressure is applied.




