Greetings! Welcome to the beautiful campus of Williston State College! Home of the Tetons! It is truly a pleasure for us to host the annual Marketplace for Kids. This event brings over 1,000 elementary students to our Campus to learn about potential careers for their future.

Williston State College provides training for students to earn Certificate or Associate degrees in 13 different disciplines including: Nursing, Business Management, Accounting, Massage Therapy, Welding, Diesel Mechanics, Agriculture, Information Technology, Sports & Recreation Management, Cybersecurity, Internet of Things, Electronic & Industrial Controls, and Petroleum Technology & Automation. Over the next two years, WSC will be adding approximately 15 new Healthcare-related programs to bring our total academic offerings to nearly **30 programs**.

Additionally, the College has a division called TrainND Northwest that provides workforce training, not requiring a degree, such as CDL Truck Driving, Crane Operator, and Certified Nursing Assistant.

The Teton sports teams compete in a variety of different sports: Women's Sports include Basketball, Volleyball, Softball, and Clay Target Shooting, while Men's Sports include Basketball, Hockey, Baseball, and Clay Target Shooting. Women's and Men's Cross-Country are our newest sports with their first season being the Fall of 2025.

WSC is updating and expanding its campus with two new Capital Projects: 1.) Transformed our baseball and softball fields to field turf to create a state-of-the-art sports complex, and 2.) Completed a new 42,000 square foot building (opening in January, 2026) to house our new Healthcare Programs.

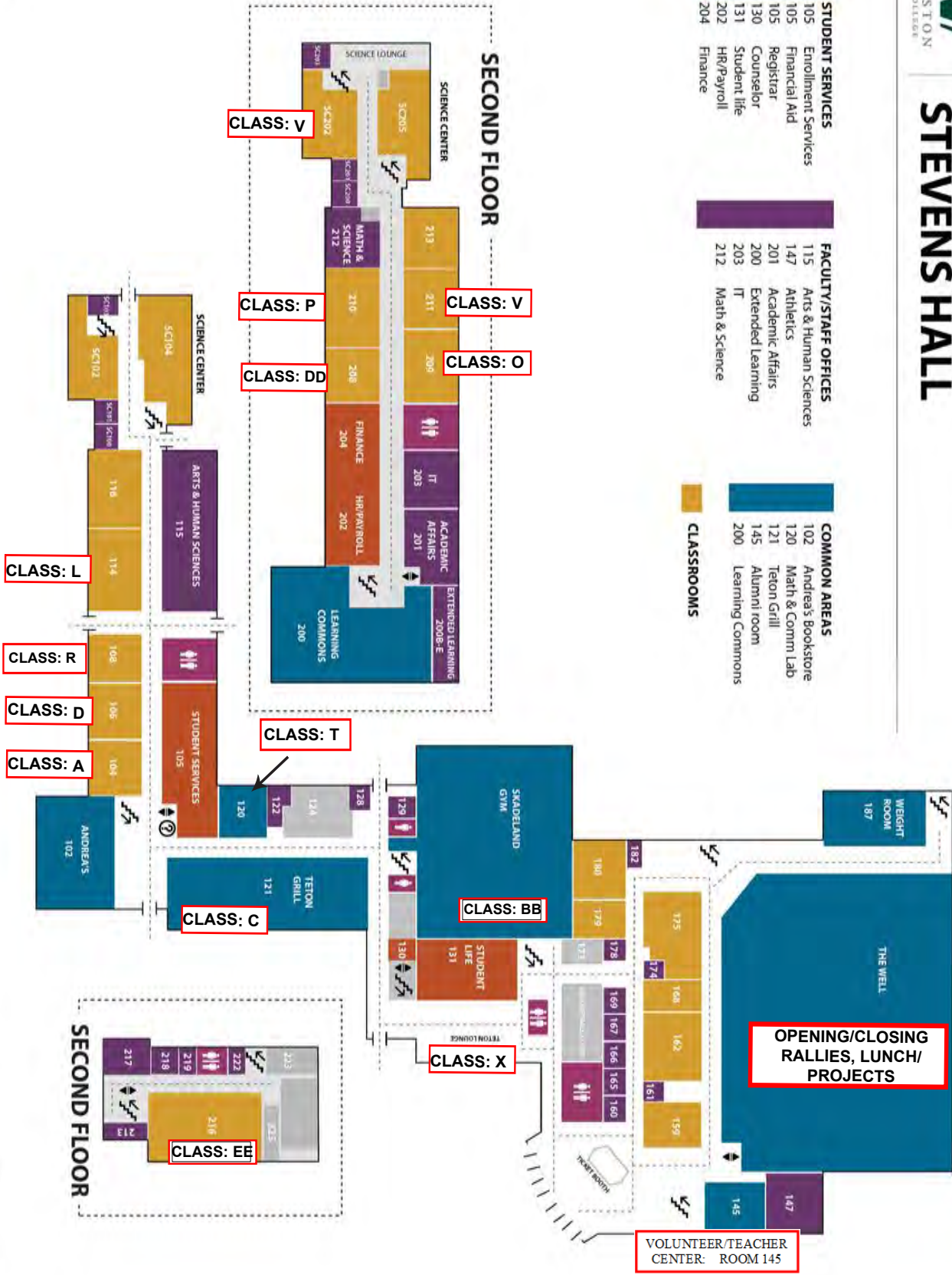


STEVENS HALL MAP



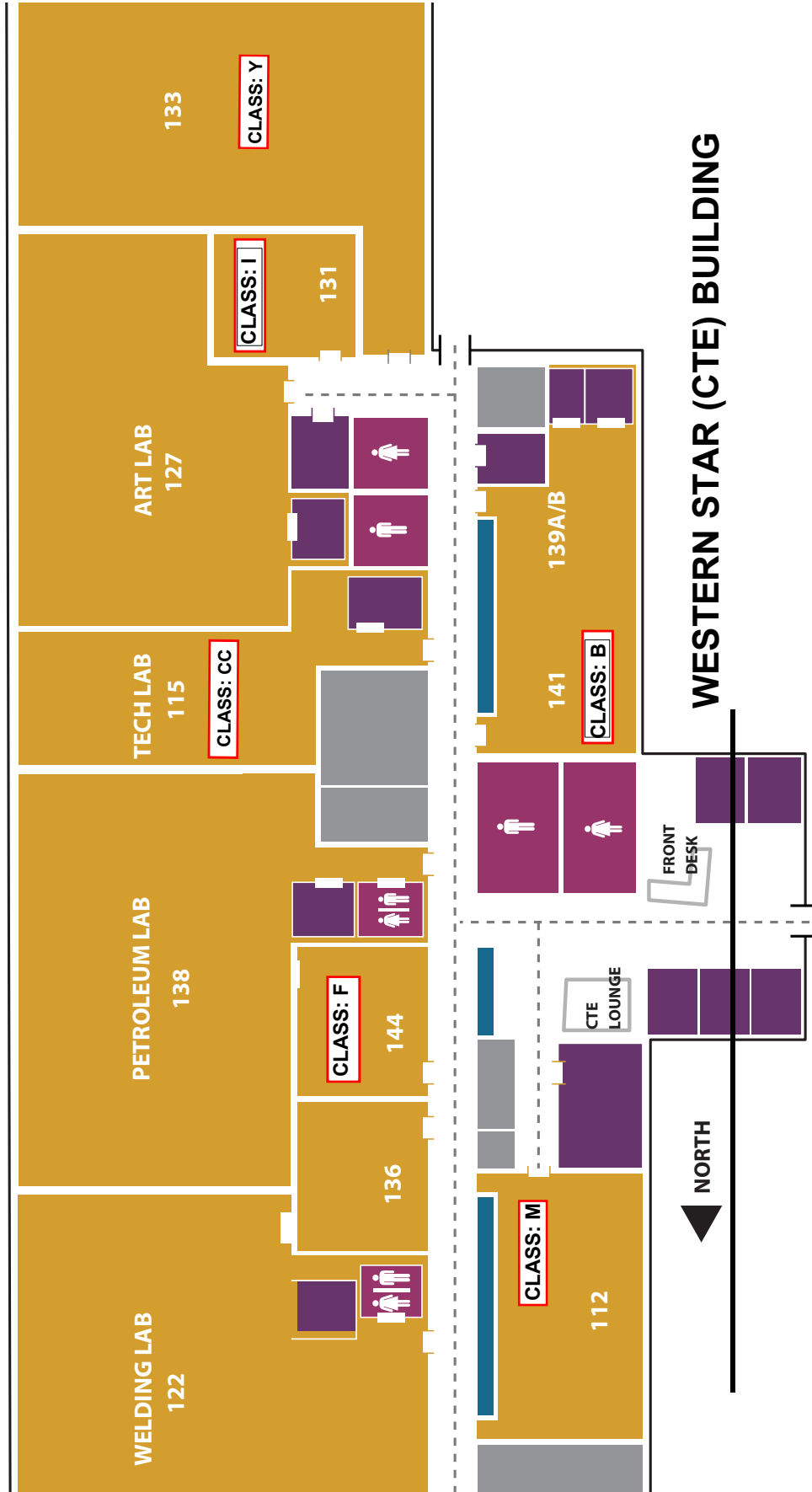

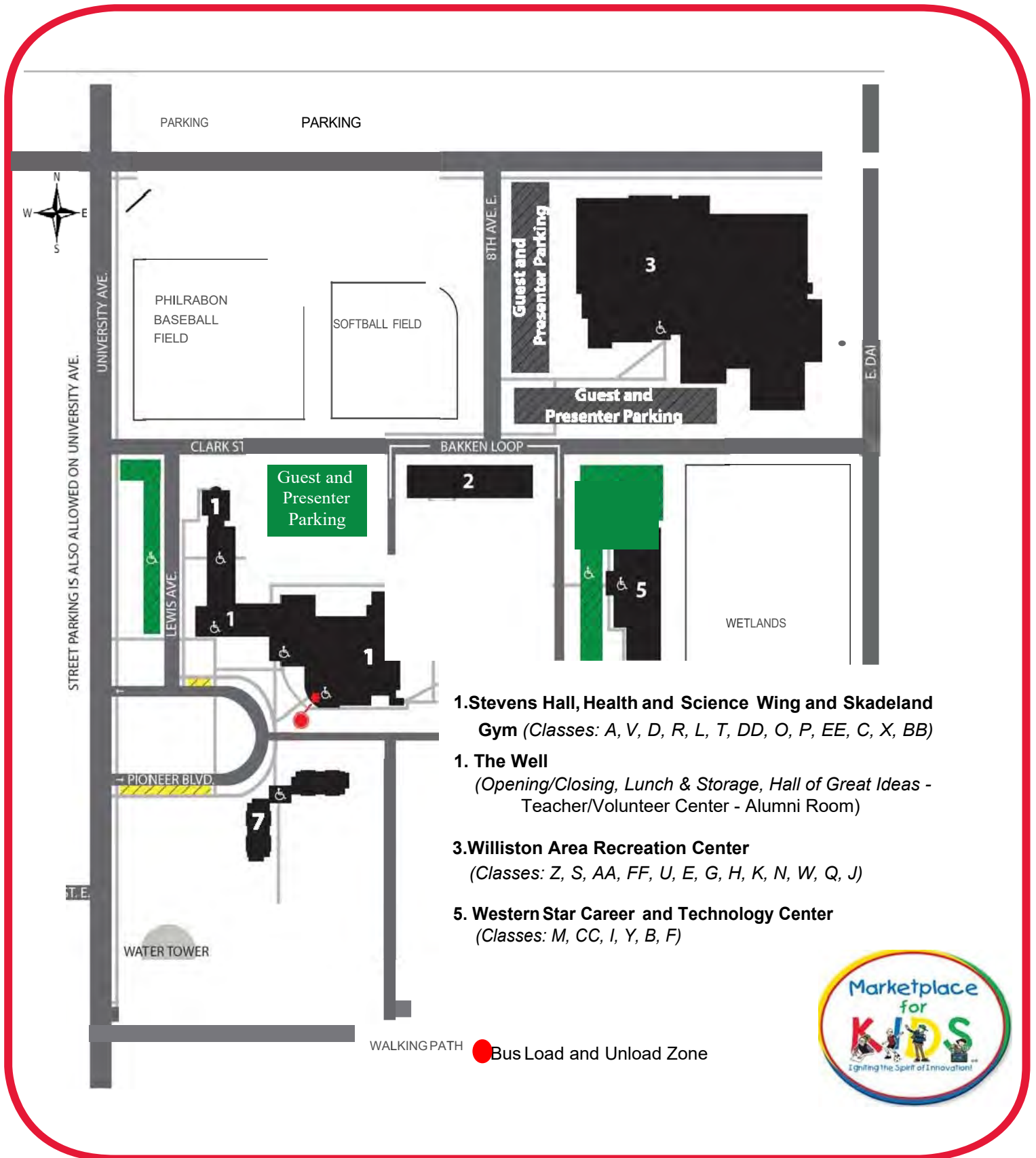

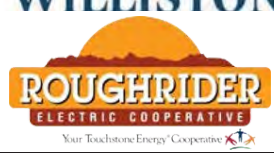
